The Holiday Season Begins

Beloved in Christ,
We stand upon the cusp of the "holiday" season. Turkeys are being purchased, plans are being made, trees are being sized up, and wish lists are eagerly given to parents and grandparents. As the song says, "It's the most wonderful time of the year..." It is easy for many of us to forget all of the difficulties, all of the pain, the loss, the disappointments, the uncertainty and fear of the future that looms large in the evening news every night. It is easy for us in the Church to put on a "happy face" and sing our Christmas hymns. But what is not so easy are the words of St. Paul in 1 Thessalonians 5: "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

While we may be able to pull off an artificial form of joy and gladness around the holidays, after the last turkey leftover sandwich has been grudgingly eaten, after the travelling is over, after the Christmas programs, and presents and extra services are

over, we are left with a cold, gray world. The news continues to depress and the reality of life in a sin-sick world again weighs our souls down.

But, we are called to rejoice ALWAYS, pray WITHOUT CEASING, and give thanks in ALL circumstances. And notice what the inspired Word of God says: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. We are not called to be happy to please God, but rather, we are called to live our new lives in Christ, as children of God, through the grace and mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ and by the sacrifice He made for us, once for all upon the cross, given in the means of grace, Baptism, Holy Absolution and the Lord's Supper, all a free gift without any merit or worthiness in ourselves.

It seems a tall order to fill, rejoicing always, praying without ceasing and giving thanks in all circumstances. But it is not our order to fill. It is not our act of obedience to please God. It is solely by His working in us that these things are accomplished. We are called to simply fix our eyes of Christ and Him crucified. This is the source

of our constant rejoicing! Christ has died for us! This is what enlivens in us a life of constant prayer. Christ, even now, is praying for us! This is how we are able to give thanks, even and especially when things are tough: Christ is our thanksgiving!

You see, our Lord Jesus Christ did not come to make us successful in this life. He did not come to make us popular. He did not come to bring us temporal health or wealth. No, our Lord Jesus Christ did not come that we may conquer this sin-sick world, for "in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us" (Romans 8:37). The gifts of Jesus, in which we rejoice always, which cause us to live lives of constant prayer and thanksgiving in all circumstances, are not merely temporal, but eternal. Nothing may now separate us from the love of God, in Christ Jesus our Lord! Oh dear Christian, rejoice at such great good news! The Lord is with you!

Reformation Sunday

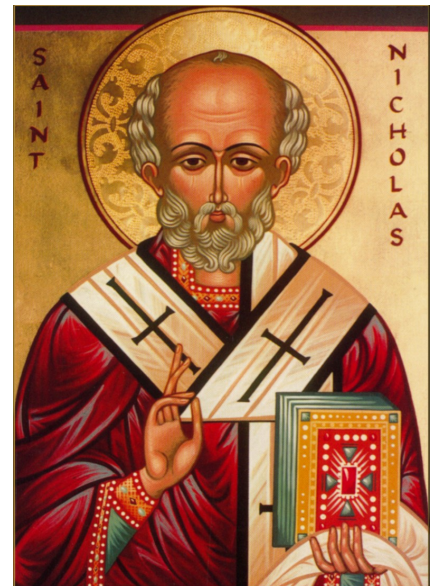

Stewardship

“Where your treasure is there your heart will be also” (Luke 12:34). Notice that our Lord does not say: Where your heart is there your treasure will be also. He says the exact opposite. Hearts follow treasure, not treasure follow hearts. And this raises a question: where is your treasure?

In other words, what do you do with your money? A quick glance through your check register will tell you. It reveals where your heart is. So, where is your heart? What do you find? If you’re honest, it will reveal two things. First, that your heart is not where it should be; and second, that you’re heart is where it should be. You ask: How can this be? How can it be both? Isn’t this a logical contradiction?

No. Because your heart is not to be in one place only. “Consider your station in life according to the Ten Commandments . . .” This we all know from the fifth chief part in Luther’s Small Catechism on Confession. Our station is our vocation. What is our station, our vocation, in life according to the Ten Commandments? Luther makes a list, but this list can be stated more generally under three categories: the Family, the State, and the Church. We have a vocation as a member of our family, of the state or society, and of the church. Vocation sets forth our relationship to those around us. Some are members of our family. Some are members of our community in society, the state. And some are members of the church, God’s own family. This is where your heart should be. It should be with your family, your state, and your church. And

since hearts follow treasures, this is where your treasure should be.

So “consider your station in life according to the Ten Commandments.” Consider your vocation. You are a member of a family. You are a member of society. You are a member of the church, God’s own family. And so you give your treasure to those who are placed under care according to your vocation. You give to your family to provide for them because God has ordered your life to be in service to the members of your family. You give to the state to provide for them because God has ordered your life to be in service to those who are fellow members of the state. You give to the church to provide for them because God has ordered your life to be in service to those who are fellow members of the Body of Christ, God’s own family.

We are beneficiaries of God’s generosity in the family, the state, and the church. This, we confess in the Apostles’ Creed as we learned it from the meanings in the Small Catechism. We have received from God, out of his divine goodness and mercy, from his rich and daily providence, all that we need for this body and life, and all that we need for the life that is yet to come. God gives; we receive. And because we have received what He has given so richly, we can’t not help but give in like measure. This is where your treasures go. And as our Lord promises, your heart shall follow.





November Newsletter

September and October was a whirlwind of activity at Christ Lutheran Academy.

The beginning of school is always filled with getting accustomed to new routines and homework, but at CLA we always manage to have some fun too. In October, the Pre-school through 3rd grade had their first field trip of the year to Green Meadows Petting Farm. The students held chickens, milked a cow, and picked their own pumpkins.



In addition to studying farm animals, the preschool and kindergarten students have been learning about bats and spiders! Ask them about what a bat family is called or how a spider makes a

web!

In Mrs. Moe's class, the first and second graders have been working hard, reading Ten Apples on Top and Ferdinand the Bull. They also have been learning about animals in science and Martin Luther in Social Studies.

The third grade has been reading the classic Paddle to the Sea. They followed the journey of a carved canoe from Canada, through the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Seaway into the sea. In language arts, third grade is working on writing personal narratives.

The fourth through eighth grades are immersed in the Middle Ages. In history they have learned about Alaric the Visigoth, Attila the Hun, and Theodore the Ostrogoth. In science they continue to learn about our solar system and in literature they are reading classics such as The Magicians Nephew and The Story of Rolf and the Viking Bow, Latin, logic, grammar, and mathematics fill the rest of the school day.

In October, we also had a special guest speaker, Egyptian Coptic Priest, Fr. Rewis Awadalla who visited the school. He led the students in a discussion of the happenings in Egypt and what it means to be a Christian in Egypt at this time.

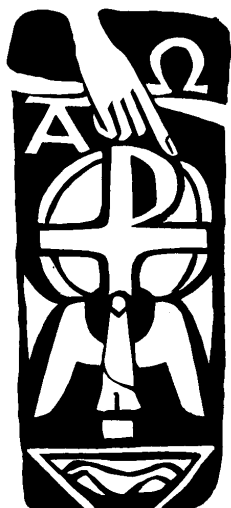
