+CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION+

The Confession and Absolution is a preparation for entering into God's presence. We are, as we rightly confess with God's Word, poor, miserable sinners. We call upon the name of the Lord given us in Holy Baptism, trusting that He who has called us is faithful and will forgive us our sins.



+SERVICE OF THE WORD+

The Service of the Word is the first high point of the Divine Service. God speaks to us through His Word (sola scriptura, that is Word Alone) and we respond with the Word He has placed among us. This service begins with an Introit or Entrance Hymn as we come into God's presence, assured of the forgiveness of sins we have received at the Holy Absolution. We continue with the Kyrie, calling for mercy with the sure and certain promise that through Christ alone, by faith alone, we receive grace.

²¹But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it—
²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: ²³for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴and are justified by his grace as a gift, through

the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. ²⁶It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. ²⁷Then what becomes of our boasting? 



+ANNOUNCEMENTS FOR THE WEEK OF OCTOBER 23, 2016+

NEW RED PARAMENTS: The Spiritual Life Council approved the purchase of new red paraments for the altar, pulpit, and lectern in honor of Messiah's 65th Anniversary. These paraments serve to beautify our altar and to teach us the faith. That we all may grow in our faith, a brief explanation of the symbols on our new paraments follows: The Pulpit has a cross with open books in each of the four quadrants. This teaches us that the eternal Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, which was accomplished for all people on the cross and written down for generations to come by the four Evangelists by inspiration of the Holy Spirit goes out to all corners of the world, "to every nation and tribe and language and people." (Rev. 14:6). The Lectern has an open Bible with the Alpha and Omega in front of an anchor. This teaches us that our Lord Jesus Christ, who is the beginning and the end, is revealed to us in the Holy Scriptures. He is our anchor which holds us steadfastly in place. The Altar superfrontal has a cross with palms on both ends. Through the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, we are victorious over sin, death, and the devil. The symbol in the middle is a cross with the Greek letters IC XC NIKA. The IC XC are the initials of Jesus Christ. Nika is the Greek word for "conquer." Through the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ we are more than conquerors. We partake of the blessings of His holy cross at the Altar where we receive His true body and blood for the forgiveness of sins. Behind the Altar are the words "Holy + Holy + Holy." We are taught by this that as we come to the Lord's table, we come into His true presence, and, like the angels in Isaiah's vision (Isaiah 6), we confess that the Triune God is holy.
