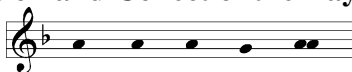

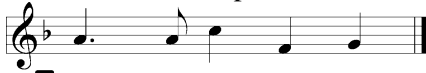
¹Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear [Jesus].
